August 1776!

**With the signing of the Declaration of Independence, "Colonies" became "States"!
As the declaration gets distributed by word of mouth to the states, enthusiasm and patriotism builds and morale is bolstered. But, new battles against the Brits are just beginning in the newly formed nation and the realities of war are catching up to the excitement of independence!**

2 Aug: While independence was approved on July 4, most delegates of the Continental Congress formally signed the parchment Declaration of Independence on this date – solidifying the political shift!

10 Aug: King George III and the British government received official word that the American colonies had declared independence.

22 Aug: British General William Howe landed over 20,000 elite Brit troops at Gravesend Bay, Long Island. The "Battle of Long Island" is the first major battle of the war since the United States declared independence.

26 Aug: General Howe launched a massive surprise night march, flanking General George Washington's forward positions who faced total annihilation! But Patriot Major Gist and his group of 400 soldiers from the 1st Maryland Regiment repeatedly charged the British stronghold with muskets and bayonets - sacrificing themselves to allow Washington's army to retreat. Their fierce rear-guard defense succeeded in stalling the British, allowing the remainder of Washington's army to safely retreat across the East River under the cover of dense fog. Of the "Maryland 400", 256 men were killed or captured. Watching the Marylanders' bravery from a nearby hill, General George Washington reportedly cried out: **"Good God, what brave fellows I must this day lose!"**

29-30 Aug: General Washington successfully evacuated 9,000 troops across the East River to Manhattan without losing a single life! His retreat was considered by some historians as defeat! But many considered his military strategy as brilliant – preventing the Continental Army from surrendering and keeping the Revolutionary War alive! Saving his troops were critical in the months to follow as General Washington had many more battles to lead for the United States! The war was far from being over!

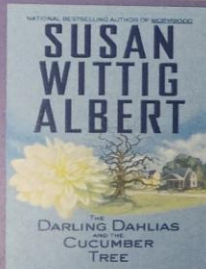

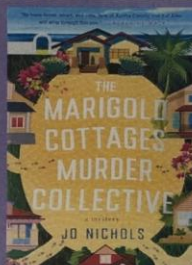

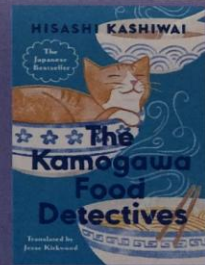

Summer Crisis Program Begins July 1

More than 55,000 Ohio households served in 2025

The Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and <insert organization> are once again offering assistance to help Ohio's families stay cool during the hot summer months.

From July 1 through Sept. 30, income-eligible Ohioans can receive assistance in paying their electric bill, purchasing an air conditioner or fan, or making repairs to their central air conditioning unit through the Ohio Department of Job and Family Service's [Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program](#) (HEAP). The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households or those that have a disconnection notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish new service on their electric bill, require air conditioning, or those with a household member age 60 or older and/or a household member with a documented medical condition. Qualifying medical conditions can include lung disease, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, asthma, and others.

To qualify for assistance, Ohioans must have a gross income at or below 175 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a family of up to seven members, and 60 percent of the State Median Income for a family of eight or more members. For a family of four, the annual income must be at or below \$57,750. Last year, the Summer Crisis Program assisted more than 55,000 households in Ohio, providing a total of \$12.4 million in benefits.

To apply for the program, clients are required to schedule an appointment with <insert local energy assistance provider organization name>. Appointments can be scheduled by calling <insert number>.

Clients need to bring copies of the following documents to their appointment:

- Copies of their most recent energy bills.
- A list of all household members and proof of income for the last 30 days or 12 months for each member.
- Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.
- Proof of disability (if applicable).
- Physician documentation that cooling assistance is needed for a household member's health.

Ohioans enrolled in the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus (PIPP) program who meet the above criteria may also be eligible for assistance, or central air conditioning repairs, or may receive an air conditioning unit and/or fan.

We also have some cleaning supplies such as laundry detergent, toilet bowl cleaner, household cleaner and more.

To place an order for personal needs, call 740-943-3095 from 10 AM to 5 PM between the 20th and 30th of each month. Your order can be picked up on the first Saturday of the month at the Richwood Greene Apartments 235 Grove St. Between the hours of 9 AM and 10 AM. Please drive to the parking lot to the back of the building. You do not need to get out of your car-someone will be there to get the order for you. You must order in advance each month as described above. If you have any questions or are in an emergency situation, please call the Richwood Civic Center office at 740-943-2310. **PNP does not accept any donations of clothing or cosmetics.**

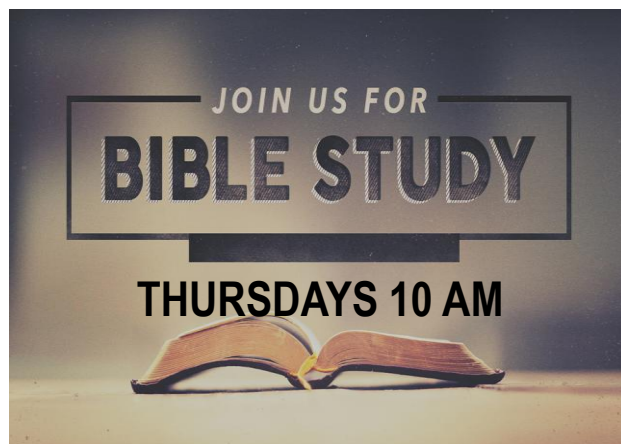

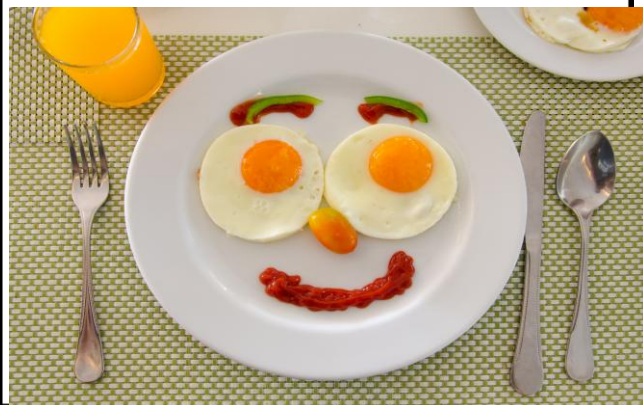
